GLADYS BLACK 'WOMAN OF DISTINCTION' AWARD'

Charmaine Spence Rochester

Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer at Penn Medicine Chester County Hospital



This year, we honor Charmaine Spence Rochester for her dedication to providing support, resources, and leadership opportunities to women of color in the financial and healthcare professions. Born in Jamaica, Charmaine went on to earn a Bachelor's degree from Howard University, an MBA from Florida Atlantic University, and Doctor of

Health Administration degree from Central Michigan University. Throughout her 28-year career, she has often found herself to be the only woman of color in the board room: "It's very humbling. There are other talented African American finance professionals who have not gotten the opportunities I have. I feel a sense of responsibility to support the growth and development of others like me who are trying to find their way."

A true champion for women, Charmaine launched the Legacy Builders Breakfast series to provide opportunities for mentoring and networking for African American women in healthcare. She serves as a mentor for young professionals from several organizations, including the Healthcare Financial Management Association (HFMA) and the National Association of Health Service Executives (NAHSE). She has been a Girl Scout troop leader and is a current board member for Community Volunteers in Medicine (CVIM). In 2018, Charmaine was named CFO of the Year by the Philadelphia Business Journal.

As an advocate for its employees, SEI encourages female employees to pursue professional and leadership opportunities through its robust Women's Network. The group hosts an annual Leadership Summit that brings together industry experts from SEI and the Philadelphia area to explore topics that support women's success and leadership. SEI has also developed an Emerging Leaders Program to encourage college-aged women to explore various career opportunities in the financial services sector. Finally, its "Get, Grow, Keep" initiative focuses on developing a clearer path for women to advance within the company, changing the internal recruitment process to make more positions available for current employees, and updating job descriptions to allow for more qualified applicants.

Globally, SEI has worked to decrease its gender pay gap; attract, promote and retain female leaders; and elevate the voices of its female employees. SEI leadership has developed a benchmark by which to measure their vision for an innovative culture that redefines gender parity standards in the financial services industry.

IN MEMORY OF GLADYS BLACK



The Gladys Black Woman of Distinction Award is named in memory of our late friend and committed Board member Gladys Black. Gladys led by example as a business leader in her field and an engaged and faithful supporter of her church, alma mater and a number of local organizations and non-profits.

A resident of Phoenixville, Gladys was a trustee of Allegheny College and in 2015 received the Alumni Medal, the college's oldest and most prestigious alumni award. In addition, Gladys was a major supporter of The Pennsylvania Ballet, People's Light, Philabundance, Episcopal Community Services and Orion Communities. She served as a membership volunteer at the Philadelphia Museum of Art and a supporter and devoted member of St. David's Episcopal Church.

In 1997, after the death of her husband, Joseph Black, she became Acting President of The Valley Forge Group comprised of Valley Forge Technical Communications in Exton and Detroit, Valley Forge Technical Information Services in Munich, Cologne and London, and Sun Technicom in Detroit.

As a business leader and supporter of women and girls in Chester County, Gladys left a lasting impact on our community. Her strength and extraordinary drive to give embodies the spirit of CCFWG - we will never forget the impact she left on us and all those fortunate to have known her.




